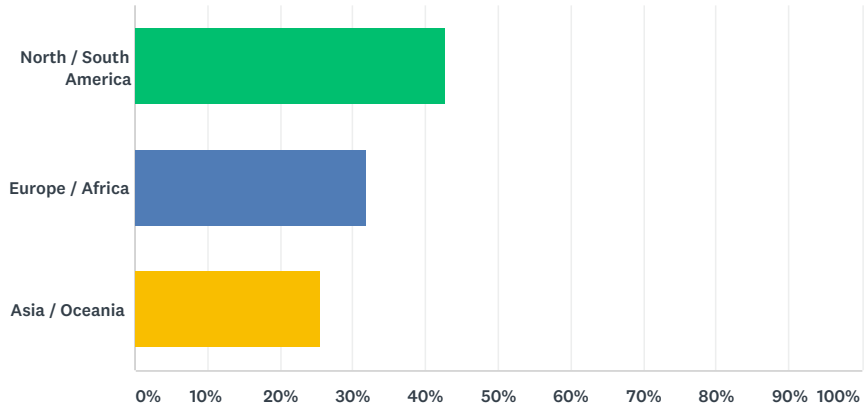


Q1 What geographic region do you reside in.

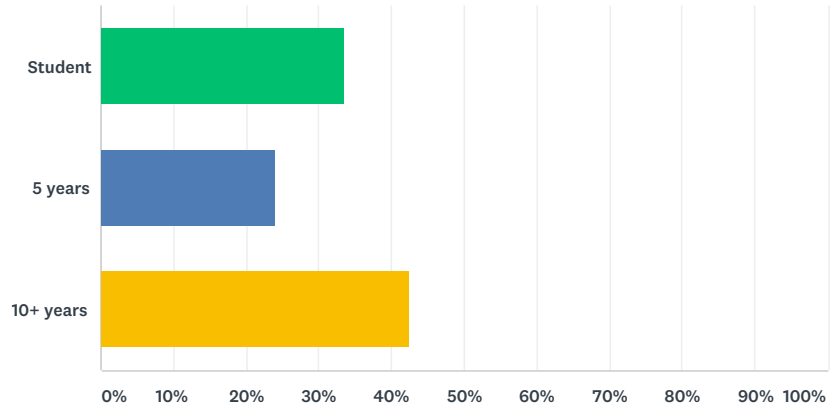

Q2 What is your level of involvement in the research community

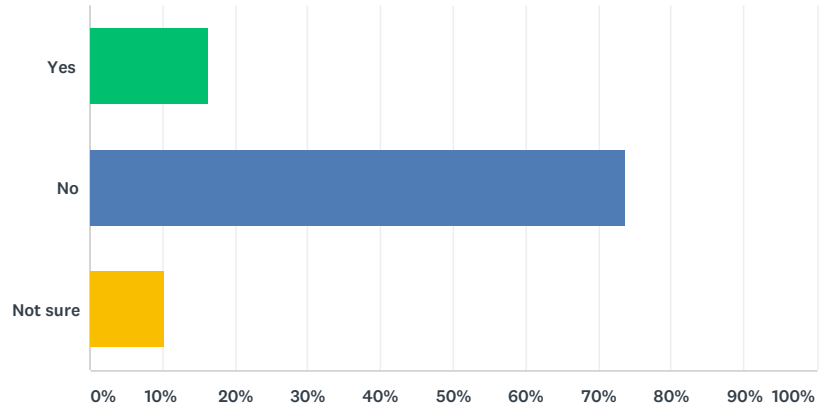

Q3 Are you attending SIGGRAPH Asia in Brisbane?

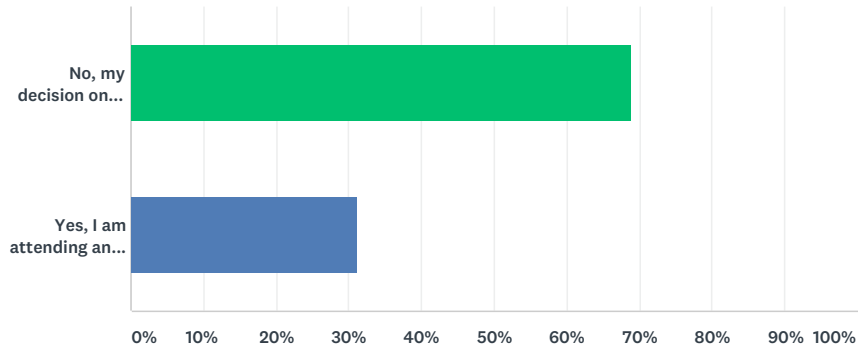

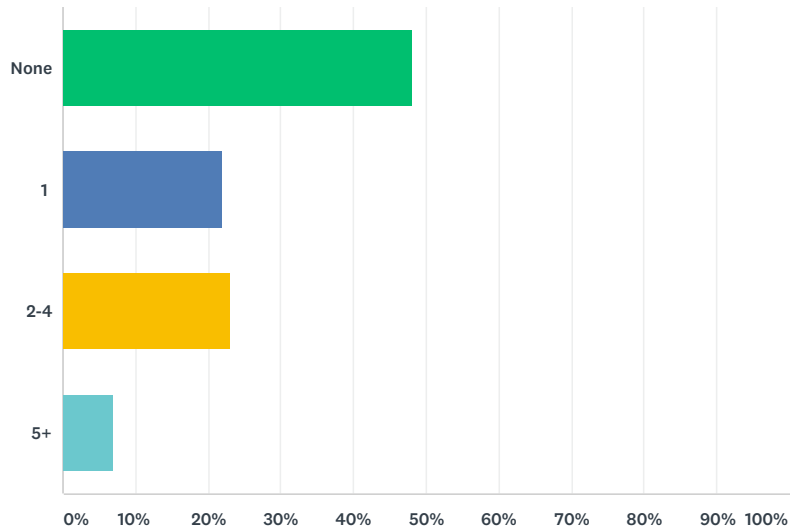

Q5 How many SIGGRAPH Asia conferences have you attended in the past 8 years?

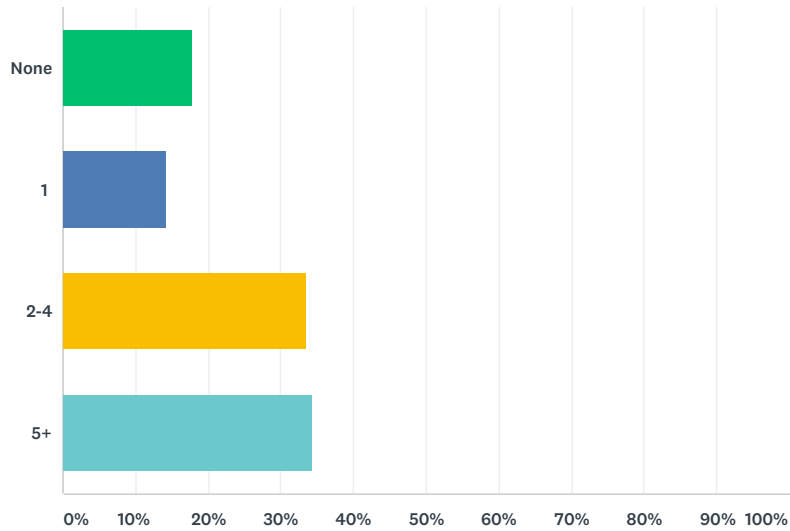

Q6 How many SIGGRAPH conferences have you attended in the past 8 years?

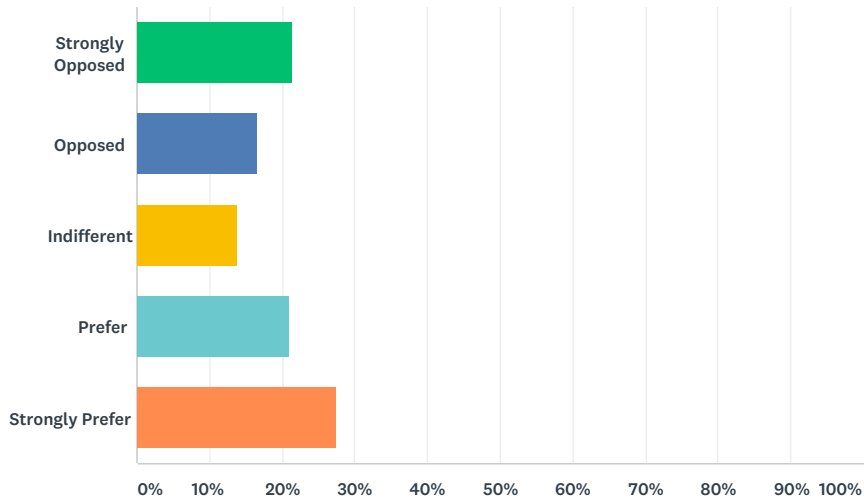

Q7 Are you in favor of moving the Technical Papers Deadline to mid to late December 2020 for SIGGRAPH 2021?

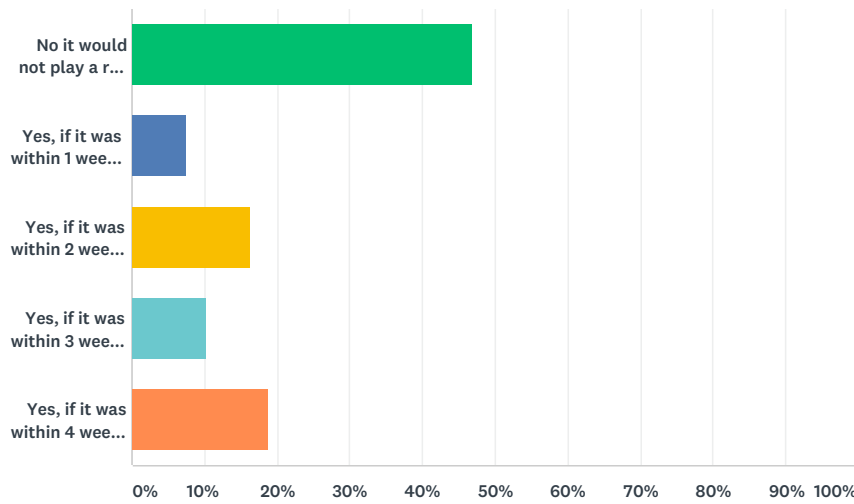

Q8 If the Technical Papers Deadline was moved to December, would it impact your decision to attend SIGGRAPH Asia in the future?

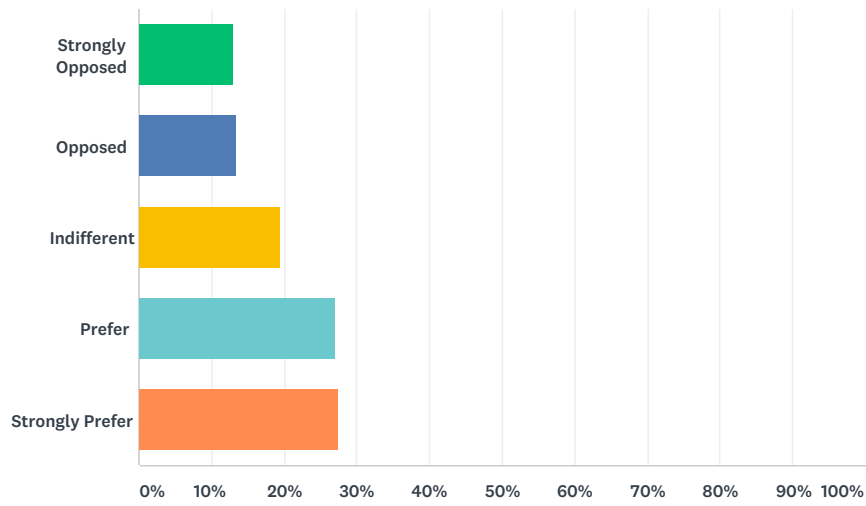

Q9 Are you in favor of moving the Technical Papers Deadline to February starting in 2021?

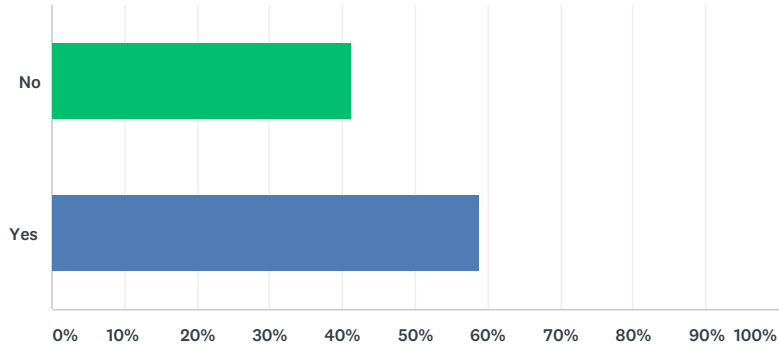

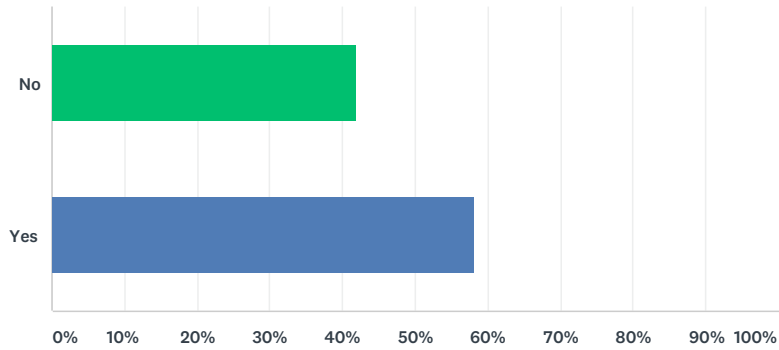

ACM SIGGRAPH should work hard to make it easier for computer graphics researchers to thrive in computer graphics, not insist on impossible deadlines that just turn people away. Graphics is a hard field to survive in as is (low funding opportunities). As per SIGGRAPH Asia, in my experience, the event is smaller than SIGGRAPH US, majority of attendees are from Asia and there is simply less things to see than at SIGGRAPH US. It is a great event with great papers, but the value of attending is lower for me than SIGGRAPH US, due to reduced networking opportunities. The papers I can always read by myself anyway. So, although I respect the venue a lot, I rarely go to SIGGRAPH Asia.
