- j. Support Needed from the EC
 - Clear policy regarding volunteer support.
 - ii. Easier permission system
 - iii. Cross-platform support for social media.
 - Need a standardized process for posting to all organizational platforms. The Standing Committee Chairs have been managing this on their own and need a point person for social media content management.
 - iv. Accessibility assistance for online events.
 - Connecting with DEI for support regarding this topic.
- 2. The difference between AAG and DAC
 - a. AAG is an advisory group that encompasses the past, present, and future art gallery and art papers chairs at SIGGRAPH and SIGGRAPH Asia.
 - i. To develop and support the PACMCGIT process for SIGGRAPH Asia Art Gallery and Papers program. SIGGRAPH Art Papers recently started being published again.
 - There is some overlap with regard to the DAC's year round activities and what's happening at the conference (bi-directional).
 - It is worth having a conversation regarding what the organization wants these two roles to be.

	spent) at SIGGRAPH 2023. This proposal is		
	considered a special project and meets the		
	requirements of a Special Project.

	i. A few companies have reached		
	wanting to sponsor a "reception-like"

	The CAG were trying to be optimistic but		
	conservative.		
	i. In the past there was always a		
	reception at SIGGRAPH; a benefit		
	for full conference registration. The		
	last reception was 2019; there wasn't		
	one last year because of the		
	uncertainty (COVID) and the reason		
	why it wasn't a part of this year's		
	budget.		
	ii. Surplus of the previous year's		
	conference going to the current		
	conferenceThe positive balance of		
	SIGGRAPH year end and finding a		
	way to return that year end plus one		
	to the current conference.		
	Discussions regarding having a		
	reception were restarted.

a. Why isn't this fund

offsetting the \$400K being requested?

- i. It can be offset but there is also a growing wishlist from program chairs to improve the attendee experience.
- b. Required contingency amount that is typically not spent.
- c. These budget items would go back to income if they are not used for that conference year. This is roughly \$300K.
- iii. In 1998 (25th celebration) \$486K from the reserve fund was approved by the EC. There is historical precedent for this request.
- iv. Recommendations/Feedback from EC.
 - 1. Return to the previous model of including receptions in the conference budget.
 - There are EC directors who encouraged the CAG to bring the reception back because it was missed.
 - b. This reception will look and feel like previous receptions and will not be a smaller reception. Looking at 2700 attendees which is on par with previous receptions.
 - Special Projects is to benefit the organization initiatives for the years to come vs. a 2 hour reception that will benefit

- a smaller group (i.e. full conference registrants).
- 3. Using the special project funds for supporting the 50th anniversary content vs. reception.

2. Vote

- Unbudgeted expenses do not need a supermajority vote but because it is \$400K recommends that this is a supermajority vote.
- b. Recommends motioning this vote and if it is seconded move to voting via email with the EC Voting alias.
 - i. Vote by mail with supermajority results. Deadline Thursday.
 - MOTION: Jesse Barker moves that the EC will vote to approve (or not) this special project request for SIGGRAPH 2023 by supermajority by end of day on Thursday June 22. David Spoelstra second.
